POST Administration includes the POST Division Administrator, Deputy Division Administrator, a management assistant, 3 regional coordinators and an in-service training assistant, the manager of the Office of Professional Standards and 10 contract investigators, a 3-member Certification Section and 4-member Curriculum Section and Production Studio.

The Basic Academy Training Bureau consists of a Bureau Manager, six training specialists, three administrative assistants, and 3 reserve training officers. The Bureau oversees the activities of agency-provided instructors, and **127** contract instructors, graders and evaluators, and training role players.

The Administrative Support Bureau engages in financial matters, IT, facilities, training records and certification management. The Bureau includes: a Bureau Manager, 1 financial specialist, 1 facilities coordinator, 1 IT specialist, and 1 office receptionist/assistant.




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Below is a synopsis of the FY2014 revenue data, July through October 2013. POST revenue primarily comes from the number of felony, misdemeanor, and traffic citations fines. The number of fines directly correlates to POST \$15 fee/fine, and to a separate fee which is 10% of 14% of each of the above fines. As you will notice, the estimated number of citation has decreased since CY 2011 and correlates to the decreasing revenue coming from the 14% of 10% of total fine revenue (a portion of yearly POST revenue).

Interesting Facts About Idaho and POST's in the United States

Idaho is 33rd in the nation for the number of POST certified officers per state. (9 non-reporting states)

Idaho is 29th in the nation for the number of basic training hours required for police officers and sheriff patrol deputies.

Idaho is 14th in the nation for the number of square miles of land, at 83,570 sq. mi., to provide law enforcement services.

The National Decertification Index has 36 contributing states, and 17,122 records. Idaho is 7th among the states with 322 records. States entering more records than Idaho are: Texas, Florida, Arizona, Oregon, Tennessee and Missouri.



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


Instructor Certifications



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


CY 2013 Decertification Cause of Actions & Status




2013 Investigation Actions

As provided above, you can see the final actions taken by the POST Council since decertification became a POST responsibility. As you review the following pages, you will see the types of actions taken by the POST Council. Please note, the rate of actions taken by POST Council has varied over the years. In years when the decertification actions increased, many of the cases were from earlier years, but resolved in the period of 2008-2012.

In 2012, the POST hearing process was changed. In the new process, POST Council allows for expedited hearings and conclusions. In addition, the POST Council initiated new investigative policies that allow for increased participation by employing agencies in contested cases; providing the employing agency formal input into the investigative decision-making. 
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
CY 2011-12 Post-Decertification Investigation Actions and Current Council Initiatives

POST Council and the Upcoming Legislature

POST Council will be bringing alternative sanctions back to the 2014 Idaho Legislature. POST Council attempted to provide for alternative sanctions during the 2012 Legislature, but was asked to remove one section and bring it back to the 2013 Legislature. Due to an administrative error, the legislation for alternative sanctions did not make it to the 2013 Legislative Session. Members of the 2013 House Judiciary and Rules Committee requested the legislation, and asked POST to resubmit alternative sanctions to the 2014 Legislature for consideration. POST Council has reviewed the alternative sanctions with the predominant law enforcement associations in Idaho, and supports the proposed legislation. The proposed sanctions would allow for suspensions of certification for up to 6 months and/or remedial training. The alternatives will allow the Council to take actions in matters with a compassionate eye, if they so choose.

POST Survey



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


Decertification By Cause of Action




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
Freedom of Information Records Requests for Training and Certification Records

Many of the requests involve many reviews of the different types of files held at POST, plus a legal review and redaction of private information. Over the past 12 months, POST has answered 82 records requests for a 6.8 record average per month.
