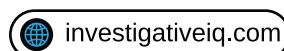

Requirements:

This is a hands-on course and participants will be required to actively participate in learning exercises throughout the course.

There will be required reading, quizzes, role-play exercises, and a final test as part of the course. Participants will be provided with their own student guide, forms packets, and material for taking notes during the course.

At the beginning of class, a scenario evaluation matrix is also provided for use in the final scenario exercise. This matrix is a useful tool for the investigator to use for self-evaluation of future interviews and interrogations.

Participants are encouraged (not mandated) to bring an existing case file to class to use as their final scenario exercise case example. The case file can be a closed or current case and should have a named suspect. The case file should also contain suspect background information. All interrogation classroom activities will be based on the case file.

Upon successful completion, participants will be issued a certificate.
